

Promontory Park Rules

General rules

Campground and park rules have been established to provide a safe and enjoyable recreational environment, and to protect the resource. Persons who do not respect the rights of other park visitors by conducting themselves outside the established park rules may be asked to leave the park without refund and may be refused future entry. Rules are subject to change by park management.

Hours information

- Entrance and overflow parking gates open at 6 a.m. and close at 10 p.m.
- Check-in time: 4 p.m.
- Check-out time: 1 p.m.
- Quiet time: 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. During quiet time, excessive noise is any noise that can be heard in neighboring campsites and could interfere with those trying to sleep.

Camping and general use

- No more than six people and no more than two tents may occupy any single campsite unless authorized by management.
- No tents on yome or cabin sites.
- Animals: Pets are not permitted on yome or cabin sites. All pets shall be kept on a leash not more than six feet long and must also be kept quiet and under physical control at all times. Pet waste must be picked up and placed into trash receptacles.
- Vehicles: Only one vehicle per campsite unless authorized by management. All vehicles must remain on paved areas and shall not extend into roadways. Boat, trailer and additional vehicle parking is available. Please inquire with park staff.
- Controlled and attended campfires are allowed in the firebox or fire ring only. All fires shall be thoroughly extinguished.
- No firearms or combative instruments are permitted in the park. Possessing, discharging or causing the discharge of any firecrackers, explosives, rockets, fireworks or other substances without prior written permission is prohibited.
- Boats must be moored at docks only, to help prevent shoreline erosion.
- Fish cleaning is allowed in designated areas only.
- Bicycles must stay on pavement and yield to pedestrians and vehicles.
- Note: Alcoholic beverages are not permitted at Promontory Park campground or day-use areas.
