

## 2018 CLEAN WIND<sup>SM</sup> C & I PROSPECTIVE PRODUCT CONTENT LABEL <sup>1</sup>

When you enroll in Clean Wind C & I for commercial & industrial customers, you purchase as many renewable energy certificates (RECs) as you choose, with a minimum purchase of 1,000 kWh per month. A REC is created when a megawatt-hour of renewable energy is produced and delivered to the grid. RECs increase demand and drive development of more renewable energy sources.

For comparison, the current average mix of resources supplying the PGE Basic Service Mix included: 11.26% Wind, 29.87% Coal, 0.33% Nuclear, 0.23% Waste, 28.43% Natural Gas, 28.65% Hydroelectric, 0.86% Biomass, 0.16% Solar and 0.21% Other. This resource mix was prepared in accordance with Oregon Administrative Rule 860-038-0300.
